## Notification on the Disclosure for Final Determination Concerning the Anti-dumping Case of Pork and Pig By-products

Delegation of the European Union to China:

The Trade Remedy Investigation Bureau of the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China presents its compliments to the Delegation of the European Union to China.

On 17 June 2024, the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China issued Announcement No. 23 of 2024, deciding to initiate an anti-dumping investigation into imports of certain pork and pork by-products originating in the European Union. On 5 September 2025, the Ministry of Commerce issued its preliminary determination in this case.

Following the preliminary determination, the Ministry of Commerce has continued its investigation. In accordance with the provisions of the Regulations of the People's Republic of China on Anti-Dumping and the Provisional Rules on the Disclosure of Anti-Dumping Investigation Information, the basic facts and determination process (public portion) on which the final determination in this case is based are hereby disclosed (see attachment). The document has also been placed in the Public Reading Room for Trade Remedy Information of the Ministry of Commerce for consultation.
